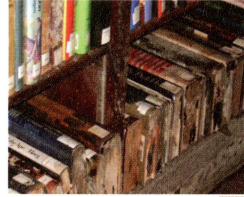


KATRINA'S DAMAGE

- Levee breaks inundated 80% of New Orleans—an area equal to 7 Manhattan Islands.
- 8 of 13 libraries were ruined.
- Nearly half of all books and other materials were destroyed.
- Initially 90% of library staff were laid off.
- Total damage exceeds \$21 million.

REBUILDING PROGRESS



- 2 ruined branches have been renovated; damage to another is being repaired.
- 6 temporary branches have been set up with help from the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation.
- Open locations total 12 (6 permanent, 6 temporary) plus 3 bookmobiles.
- Staff has risen to 104; pre-Katrina, NOPL employed 216.
- Archives & Special Collections survived in their basement location; planning is under way to find a safer home.

PLANS AND PRIORITIES 2007

Our goal is to “build back better,” not merely “return to normal.” By autumn, NOPL will have a master plan to guide our rebuilding. The working projection is \$35 million to build better branches—and more funds to improve and expand the Main Library.

MEANWHILE, OUR IMMEDIATE PRIORITIES:

- Extend service to recovering areas via temporary branches and bookmobiles.
- Update and rebuild our collection: Donations have enabled growth to 56% of pre-Katrina size. Temporary branches, although small, have shelves to fill!
- Fund and complete immediately needed repairs at our open locations.
- Safeguard Archives & Special Collections.
